

The African Development Bank Fellowship for Emerging Fund Managers


This is a 8-month, pan-African fellowship program designed to support emerging fund managers in the African Private Equity and Venture Capital industry. The fellowship aims to deepen skills and expertise by offering expert insights, practical tools, and valuable networking opportunities to build relations with limited partners, refine investment theses and increase operational efficiency.

Private Equity and Venture Capital Funds: Closing the gap, but struggling to scale

Emerging fund managers are often focused on specific countries, where they play a critical role in building entrepreneurs' trust, conducting thorough due diligence, and navigating complex local regulatory landscapes. Despite their strong local presence and high additionality—reaching more Small Growing Businesses (SGBs) per dollar and investing earlier in the growth journey—they continue to face significant challenges in raising capital and scaling their operations.

Challenges for emerging fund managers

- × The challenge of securing Limited Partners commitments building trust with institutional investors and Development Finance Institutions.
- × Fund structuring complexities balancing risk, return expectations, and investor requirements.
- × **Operations:** managing teams and executing deals effectively.
- × **Environmental, Social and Governance aspects** climate finance, gender-lens investing, and impact measurement are increasingly shaping Limited Partners decisions.
- × Access to Networks lack of established networks with Limited Partners
- × **Structural barriers** macroeconomic constraints (e.g. limited capital availability, economic instability) and perception-related barriers (e.g. investor bias against women-led or youth-led funds, perceived higher risk)

The AfDB's Fellowship for Emerging Fund Managers directly addresses the challenges faced by emerging African fund managers, offering expert insights, practical tools, and valuable networking opportunities to scale successfully. It is powered by I&P who has a unique experience as a Limited Partner, having raised 480m USD and backed 24 emerging fund managers in 10 years.

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
